# The Comptroller and Auditor General sets out her Strategy and Audit Plan for 2023-26

## Comptroller and Auditor General issues Jersey Audit Office Strategy 2023-26 and Comptroller and Auditor General Audit Plan 2023-26

Comptroller and Auditor General (C&AG), Lynn Pamment, has today, 18 January 2023, published two documents: the **Jersey Audit Office Strategy 2023-26** and the **Audit Plan 2023-26**.

The **Jersey Audit Office Strategy** outlines the approach and ambitions of the C&AG and the Jersey Audit Office (JAO) for the next four years. During the period of the Strategy the ambitions of the C&AG and JAO will remain constant, to:

- be a high performing audit organisation
- support effective scrutiny and accountability
- make a difference; and
- build a better organisation.

Aligned with these ambitions, the Strategy sets out the JAO's values and the key activities planned for the period. It includes Key Performance Indicators that the C&AG will use to report publicly on progress through her annual reports.

The end of June 2023 will mark the mid-term point of the appointment of Lynn Pamment as C&AG. She will use this point to reflect on priorities for the remaining term of her appointment.

**The Audit Plan** sets out the audit work that the C&AG proposes to undertake in each of the years 2023 to 2026 and the audit objectives to which the work relates (internal control, value for money and/or corporate governance).

The Audit Plan includes an element of follow up in each year of recommendations made by the C&AG in previous years. It also includes a continued focus on transparency and best practice in Annual Reporting following the publication of her third report *Annual Reporting* and accompanying updated *Good Practice Guide* in November 2022.

During 2023 the C&AG plans to consult publicly on a revised Code of Audit Practice that underpins the way in which audit work is undertaken. The proposed revisions to the Code will reflect a number of updates including to align with international professional standards for public sector auditing issued by the International Organisation of Supreme Audit Institutions (INTOSAI).

**Lynn Pamment said:**

“Independent external audit is an important part of the process of accountability for the use of public money. It provides assurance on the management of public funds and on corporate governance. The role of independent audit is even more important in these extraordinary times as we see huge pressures on public services as well as high levels of risk and uncertainty.

As the Jersey Audit Office works through the delivery of this Strategy, I will report publicly through my annual reports on the progress we are making. I will continue to review and refine the Strategy on at least an annual basis and the C&AG Audit Plan on at least a quarterly basis. My work will continue to include the important element of following up on the progress being made in the implementation of C&AG recommendations.”
