POSITIVE STEPS BEING TAKEN TO ADDRESS WEAKNESSES IN COMMUNITY HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES BUT CHALLENGES REMAIN

Comptroller and Auditor General issues latest report

Comptroller and Auditor General (C&AG) Karen McConnell has today (10 December 2015) issued a report on the management of community health and social services delivered by the Community and Social Services Directorate (C&SSD) of the States of Jersey's Health and Social Services Department (HSSD).

This is a complex area which has been subject to a number of reviews, including in 2008 when important changes were recommended to children's services. Change following those reports was slow but from 2014 concerted action has been taken to improve the management of services for children.

In this report the C&AG examines the effectiveness of the changes in services for children and how learning is transferred to other services, including those for vulnerable adults.

The C&AG found:

- Good arrangements in place for the implementation of the-changes to community-based services following the 2012 White Paper '*Caring for each other, Caring for ourselves*'.
- The absence of a comprehensive approach to the management of delivery of day-to-day services across C&SSD despite initial steps to develop and implement such a framework.

The report concludes that the challenge is to put in place robust and resilient arrangements across the whole of C&SSD, learning from the positive steps taken in the implementation of the changes following the White Paper, to ensure that:

- the right culture permeates throughout C&SSD;
- risks are systematically assessed and responded to;
- relevant, reliable and timely information is available to staff and managers;
- efficient and effective operational arrangements are in place; and
- effective scrutiny and review of activities takes place and is used to drive improvement.



Karen McConnell said:

"The States are taking steps to make effective changes to the way that services are provided to children and vulnerable adults but more needs to be done. With an increasingly elderly population there needs to be a stronger focus on learning from the acknowledged problems with Children's Services and transferring that learning to services for vulnerable adults."

"The lack of effective arrangements, poor information and a lack of consistency in management means there is a risk that issues are masked. There needs to be an increased focus on working with the rest of HSSD, other States departments, the voluntary and community sectors and service users."
